



pastor's Corner

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross



The feast we celebrate today has its origin in the first centuries of Christianity. According to ancient testimony, this commemoration began the day the Cross of Our Lord was found. It developed quickly in the Eastern Church and soon spread throughout all of Christendom. In Rome a solemn procession from the Basilica of St. Mary Major to that of St. John Lateran took place to venerate the Holy Cross before Mass.

At the beginning of the seventh century the Persians ransacked Jerusalem. They destroyed many churches and took possession of the sacred relics. A few years later the Emperor Heraclius recovered them. According to pious tradition, the splendidly-dressed monarch, in full regalia, personally wanted to carry the Holy Cross to its original place on Calvary. The weight became increasingly unbearable as he walked on the Via Dolorosa.

The Bishop of Jerusalem, Zechariah, explained to him that to carry the Cross he must imitate the poverty of Christ, who bore it free of every earthly attachment. Heraclius immediately divested himself of the imperial garments and put on humble pilgrim's clothes. He was then able to carry the Holy Cross, unshod, to the summit of Golgotha.

As our Lord chose the cross as the means whereby he would purchase for us our salvation, it is important that we commemorate this day and reflect on the importance of the cross and it's place in our life. A Father of the Church teaches: The Cross is a shield against the devil as well as a trophy of victory.










pastor's Corner

光榮十字聖架慶日 本堂神父的話



我們今天所慶祝的節日,可以追溯至基督信仰初世紀。根據古代的見證,這個慶日始於找到主耶穌的十字架之日。這傳統在東方教會很快發展起來,並很快傳遍整個基督信仰世界。在羅馬,曾舉行隆重的遊行,從聖母大殿到拉特朗聖若望大殿,在彌撒之前朝拜十字聖架。

七世紀初,波斯人洗劫了耶路撒冷,毀壞了許多聖堂,並奪走了聖物。幾年後,拜占庭皇帝赫拉克略將之奪回。根據虔敬的傳統,這位身著華麗禮服的君王,親自想把十字聖架抬回加爾瓦略山原來的位置。但當他走在苦路上時,覺得十字架愈來愈沉重,難以承受。

耶路撒冷主教匝加利亞向他解釋,若要 背負十字架,就必須效法基督的貧困——祂 背負十字架時,毫無任何世俗依附。赫拉克 略立即脫下帝王的華服,換上卑微朝聖者的 衣裝,他便能夠赤足背負十字聖架登上加爾 瓦略山頂。

由於我們的主親自選擇以十字架作為救贖我們的工具,因此我們紀念這一天,並反思十字架的重要性及它在我們生命中的地位,格外有意義。教父曾教導說:十字聖架既是對抗魔鬼的盾牌,也是勝利的標記。

上主日,我們舉行了第四屆「聖體堂美 食嘉年華」,獲得極大成功。我知道許多人 原以為會下雨,甚至擔心一定會下雨,但我 們熱切祈禱,上主遂收住了雨水,為此我們 衷心感謝天主。

特別感謝 Annie 和她的團隊——包括家 長、教友與義工們,他們負責佈置、售賣食 物與票券,最後還把一切收拾乾淨。

天主正在祝福我們的「十年願景」,我 們必須繼續邁步向前!

4 Beautiful Gifts to Offer the Blessed Virgin Mary on Her Birthday



According to Catholic tradition, the Blessed Mother was born to Saints Joachim and Anne, a pious elderly couple who had remained childless.

Catholics believe that Mary was conceived without sin and was chosen by God to be the Mother of His Son. The feast of the Nativity of Mary emphasizes her unique role in God's plan for salvation!

What better way to celebrate Mother Mary's birthday than by giving her one (or more!) of the following gifts?



1) Pray the Rosary.

By meditating on the Rosary, we contemplate the life of Jesus Christ through the eyes of His Mother, Mary.

Take the time to pray the Joyful Mysteries of the Holy Rosary since her birthday falls on a Monday this year.

You can also pray an entire Rosary by meditating on <u>all 20 mysteries</u> of the Rosary:

The Joyful Mysteries, The Sorrowful Mysteries, The Glorious Mysteries, and The Luminous Mysteries.

2) Fresh Flowers

Deliver a bouquet of fresh flowers to a Marian statue at your local parish in honor of her birthday. You can also make a special Marian shrine at home with a vase of your favorite blooms.

There are even specific flowers associated with Our Blessed Mother, such as roses or lilies!

3) Contribute to a pro-life organization in honor of Our Lady's "Yes."

Remember Our Blessed Mother's acceptance of God's will amidst uncertainty by giving your time, talent, or treasure to a pro-life organization or local pregnancy resource center.

Say a <u>special prayer to Our Lady of Guadalupe</u>, patroness of the unborn.

4) Begin or renew your Marian consecration.

Have you ever consecrated yourself to the intercession of Our Blessed Mother?

ChurchPOP has a thorough consecration guide here.

Through consecration of oneself to Jesus through Mary, we acknowledge her role as the Mother of Our Lord and entrust our intentions to her intercession. We believe that she hand-delivers our prayers to her most Holy Son! We worship God more fully by honoring His Mother—especially on her birthday.

Here is <u>a prayer</u> for Our Blessed Mother's birthday:



This volunteer opportunity will count toward the school participation hours.


We have 3 schedules available:

Thank you so very much for the warm welcome extended to me as the new Archbishop. I am really enjoying getting to know the people of this local Church. In particular, I look forward to meeting the Indigenous Peoples of this area.

One of the most important things I've learned from our Indigenous brothers and sisters across Canada is the power of listening—truly listening. Taking the time to hear someone's story is a way of saying: "You are worthy of being listened to." It is a profound way of honouring the dignity of the person.

As I begin my ministry here, I carry in my heart the call to truth and healing between the Church and Indigenous peoples. It has been part of my ministry for many years, and I have witnessed both the wounds of our past and the hope that grows when we walk together.

One concrete way we continue this journey is through our Healing and Reconciliation Collection on September 14.

The projects supported by this collection are shaped locally in partnership with First Nations communities. These initiatives are helping Indigenous peoples embrace their identity through language revitalization, cultural knowledge, and wellness. These projects connect individuals who might otherwise feel isolated and help ensure that those who have often faced discrimination can access healthcare and other services with dignity and respect.

These efforts remind us that reconciliation is not just an institutional effort, but a human journey that touches lives and builds hope, one person at a time.

I invite each of you to pray for ongoing healing and consider supporting this collection. Together, we can help bring about the vision of unity to which Christ calls us.
