STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

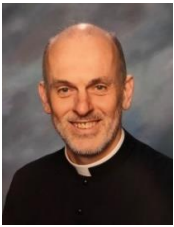

Pastor's Corner

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Remember that we are in the month of the Holy Souls. It is so important that we remember in our prayers, our sacrifices, and our suffrages these souls of the departed who are now being purified before they can see God face-to-face.

So, you know what “suffrages” are – Fr. John Hardon defines them as: **“The prayers prescribed, or promised for specific intentions. More particularly, suffrages are the Masses, prayers, or acts of piety offered for the repose of the souls of the faithful departed.”** *Modern Catholic Dictionary*

Fr. Richard passed this article to me and I recommend that everyone, everyone read it! The article starts: **“Canada’s 2021 census shows almost half of the residents of diverse Metro Vancouver now report having no religion — a much higher ratio than in virtually any big city in North America.”**

This coming Friday, November 11th is Remembrance Day. Why do we keep this day? It is a holiday, so it can be easy to forget what it is all about.

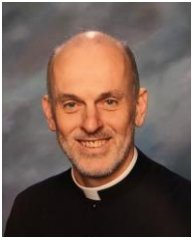
“Remembrance Day is a yearly memorial day that is observed in many Commonwealth countries, including Canada, to remember those who died in military service, and honour those who served in wartime. It is observed across Canada each year on 11 November, the anniversary of the Armistice agreement of 1918 that ended the First World War. On Remembrance Day, public ceremonies and church services often include the playing of “Last Post,” a reading of the fourth stanza of the poem *For the Fallen*, and two minutes of silence at 11 a.m. Wreaths are laid at local war memorials and assemblies are held in schools. Millions of Canadians wear red poppy pins in the weeks leading up to and on November 11th in remembrance.” *Online Canadian Encyclopedia*

It is important that we stop for these 2 minutes and pray for the repose of the soul of the soldiers who sacrificed their lives for our freedom AND also to give thanks to God for the freedom we have. The best way to give thanks? Use freedom in accord with God’s will.

下星期五，11 月 11 日是國殤日。我們為什麼要有這一天呢？它是一假日，所以很容易忘記它的真意。

『國殤日是每年一次紀念的日子，很多的聯邦國家，包括加拿大在內都在這天紀念為戰爭捐軀的軍人，並光榮那些在戰爭時服役的。每年橫跨加拿大在 11 月 11 日，1918 年終止了第一次世界大戰的停火協議仍然遵行。在國殤日，公眾的儀式和宗教的禮儀中往往包含演奏『Last Post，』朗讀詩篇 *For the Fallen* 的第四節，及在上午 11 時的兩分鐘靜默。在紀念碑上獻上花環，學校舉行集會。百萬的加拿大人在這幾星期內帶上罌粟襟針至 11 月 11 日以作紀念。』請見 *Online Canadian Encyclopedia*
