**4<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Lent**  
**Pastor's Corner**



This Sunday's Gospel presents one of the most striking encounters in the Gospels: the healing of the man born blind (John 9). Notice the detail, he is not simply blind; he has been **blind from birth**.

Jesus restores his sight, but the miracle reveals something even deeper. There is a profound **paradox** in this Gospel.

The man who had been blind comes to **see** who Jesus truly is and as the encounter unfolds, his understanding deepens until he finally recognizes Jesus as the Son of Man and **worships Him**.

The lesson for us is clear. Physical sight is not the same as **spiritual vision**.

Lent invites each of us to pray:  
*"Lord, help me to see."*

Help me to see who You truly are.  
 Help me to recognize You present in the **Blessed Sacrament**.  
 Help me to see the world through **Your eyes**, not merely through my own assumptions or habits.

Only then can we do what the man born blind ultimately did: **worship Him**.

Last weekend our parish experienced a wonderful moment of community at the **Lunar New Year Capital Campaign Dinner** held at Sun Sui Restaurant. With **27 tables filled**, the evening was joyful, vibrant, and deeply encouraging.

It was not only festive, it was also **Holy Spirit-filled**. There was a beautiful sense that we were gathering not simply as individuals, but as a **parish family** united in a shared mission.

I want to briefly recall the key points I shared that evening.

**Five Key Reflections for Our Parish**

**1. Every generation receives the Church as a gift — and becomes responsible for handing it on.**

You and I have inherited the faith, the parish, and this sacred place from those who came before us. Now it is our turn to ensure that what we have received is faithfully handed on to those who will come after us.

**2. Renewal begins on our knees.**

The future of our parish will not ultimately be secured by buildings or plans, but by **prayer**. We must continue to pray for the mission entrusted to us: the seismic upgrading of our church, the completion of the campus master plan, and the future expansion of our **Adoration Chapel**, which I hope will one day be three or four times larger so that even more people can gather before the Lord in prayer.

**3. Blessing is given for mission.**

The blessings we receive are never simply for ourselves. They are entrusted to us **for a purpose**. The blessings our parish has received — our people, our faith, our vision — exist so that we may carry out the mission God has given us.

**4. We are not building structures for ourselves — we are building platforms for the Gospel.**

Every aspect of our campus renewal must be understood in this way. The goal is not simply construction. The goal is **mission** — spaces that allow the Gospel to be proclaimed, people to encounter Christ, and disciples to be formed.

**5. The question each of us must ask:**

*"Lord, what do You ask of me?"*

**Or perhaps even more personally:**  
*"Lord, what do You want of me?"*

God has already entrusted each of us with the **gift of faith** and countless other blessings. The question now is how we will respond.

**Gratitude**

The evening was also a remarkable success in supporting our capital campaign, raising approximately **\$143,330!**

As we now enter the **fourth week of Lent**, the Church continues to lead us toward the great celebration of the **Sacred Triduum** - Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the victory of Christ proclaimed on Easter Sunday.

Let us continue to pray for the grace of **spiritual sight**.



## 四旬期第四主日 本堂神父的話



本主日的福音呈現了福音書中最震撼的相遇之一：耶穌治好那位生來瞎眼的人（若望福音第九章）。請留意這個細節，他不只是瞎眼，而是從出生起就看不見。

耶穌恢復了他的視力，但這個奇蹟揭示了更深的真理：這段福音蘊含著一個深刻的悖論。

那位曾經瞎眼的人逐漸看清耶穌真正是誰；隨著整個相遇的展開，他的理解愈來愈深，直到最後他認出耶穌是人子，並朝拜祂。

對我們而言，教訓十分清楚：肉眼的視力，並不同於心靈的視覺。

四旬期邀請我們每一位祈求：

「主，請幫助我看見。」

求祢讓我看見祢真正的面貌。

求祢讓我認出祢臨在於至聖聖體中。

求祢讓我以祢的眼光看世界，而不只是依循我自己的假設或習慣。

唯有如此，我們才能如同那位生來瞎眼的人一樣：朝拜祂。

上週末，我們堂區在新端華酒家舉行的農曆新年基建籌款晚宴中，經歷了一個美好的團體時刻。全場 27 桌座無虛席，整個晚上充滿喜樂、活力，也帶來深深的鼓舞。

這不僅是一場熱鬧的聚會，更是一個充滿聖神臨在的時刻。大家聚在一起，不只是以個人的身份，而是以同屬一個使命的堂區家庭相聚。

我想簡短重溫當晚與大家分享反思。

### 堂區的五項重要反思

1. 每一代都領受了教會的恩典，也肩負著傳承的責任。

你和我都承繼了信仰、堂區，以及從前人中承受了這片聖地。現在輪到我們，確保我們所領受的，能忠實地傳給下一代。

2. 更新始於屈膝祈禱。

堂區的未來最終不是靠建築或計畫，而是靠祈禱。我們必須繼續為使命祈禱：教堂的抗震工程、整個校園總體規劃的完成，以及未來朝拜小堂的擴建，我盼望有一天它能擴大三至四倍，讓更多人能在主前祈禱。

3. 祝福是為使命而賜下的。

我們所領受的祝福從來不是只為自己，而是付託我們一個使命。堂區所擁有的恩典——我們的教友、信仰與願景——都是為了完成天主交付給我們的使命。

4. 我們建造的不是為自己，而是為福音預備的平台。

校園更新的每一部分都必須以此為核心。目標不只是建築，而是使命——是一個地方讓福音得以宣講、讓人能遇見基督、讓門徒得以培育。

5. 每個人都必須問的一個問題：

「主，祢要我做什麼？」

或更個人地：

「主，祢對我有什麼要求？」

天主已將信仰與無數恩典託付給我們，而現在的問題是：我們將如何回應？
