April 26 - 4th Sunday of Easter, Good Shepherd Sunday

“And Peter said to them, ‘Repent, and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ...’” Acts 2:38

The word “repent” means to turn from sin - to change our thoughts, words and actions. Change that is permanent comes from within – a transformation or conversion of heart. This requires prayer, discipline and perseverance. Change is hard. The first step is recognizing that we are broken and that we need God’s help. The good news - we are not alone in our journey. Pastor's Corner

4th Sunday of Easter
Pastor's Corner



This Sunday, the Church gives us the beautiful image of the **Good Shepherd**, Jesus Christ, who says:

“My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me.” (John 10:27)

In the time of Our Lord, a shepherd did not drive the sheep from behind. He walked ahead of them. The sheep followed because they **knew his voice**. Even when multiple flocks were mixed together, each sheep recognized its own shepherd and followed him.

Whose voice am I, are you listening to?

There are many voices competing for our attention today:

- The noise of the world
- The pull of busyness and distraction
- Our own thoughts and preferences
- and yes, even the subtle voice of the enemy

Only one voice though, leads to life.

“Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well.” (Matthew 6:33)

If Christ is truly our Shepherd, there will be visible signs:

- We make time for **Sunday Mass**.
- We make time for **daily prayer**.
- We order our lives around Him, not fit Him into what is left.

We cannot say He is first if everything else consistently comes before Him, or when he is first, but only when it is convenient for us.

This Sunday is also **World Day of Prayer for Vocations**.

“The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.” (Matthew 9:37–38)

The question is not whether vocations are needed, they are!

The question is: **are we praying for them?**

- Are we intentionally praying for priests each week?
- Are we offering sacrifices for vocations?
- Are we creating homes where young people can hear God's voice?

God is still calling. The issue is not His silence, but whether we are listening.

These weeks are filled with grace in our parish:

- Our **Grade 2 children** are receiving their **First Holy Communion**.
- Our **Grade 7 students** will soon receive the **Sacrament of Confirmation**.

These are not just events—they are moments of real encounter with Christ.

Let us pray:

- For **parents**, to lead by example in faith
- For **our young people**, to remain rooted in the Mass and parish life
- For our parish, to continue growing as a community of disciples

This week, take time to ask honestly:

- Who is shaping my decisions?
- What truly has priority in my life?
- Do I recognize the voice of the Good Shepherd?

and then respond, because in the end, we will discover something very simple and very true:

- ☞ We are all following someone.
- ☞ We are all listening to a voice.

May it be the voice of Christ.

God bless you and let us continue to pray for vocations.

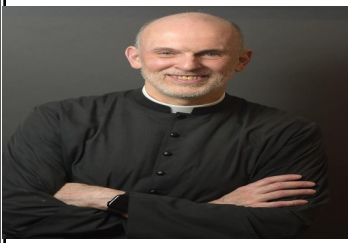

復活期第四主日 本堂神父的話

本主日，教會呈現給我們一幅美麗的圖像——**善牧耶穌基督**。

祂說：「**我的羊聽我的聲音，我也認識他們，他們也跟隨我。**」（若望福音 10:27）

在耶穌的時代，牧羊人不是在羊群後面驅趕牠們，而是走在羊群前面。羊之所以跟隨，是因為牠們**認得牧人的聲音**。即使不同羊群混在一起，每隻羊仍能辨認自己的牧人，並跟隨他。

那麼，我、你，我們到底在聽誰的聲音呢？

今天，有許多聲音在爭奪我們的注意力：

- 世界的喧囂
- 忙碌與分心的牽引
- 我們自己的想法與偏好
- 甚至，魔鬼那細微而隱晦的誘惑

然而，只有一個聲音能引領我們走向生命。

「**你們先該尋求天主的國和祂的義德，這一切自會加給你們。**」（瑪竇福音 6:33）

若基督真是我們的善牧，我們的生活必會有明顯的記號：

- 我們為**主日彌撒**預留時間
- 我們為**每日祈禱**預留時間
- 我們以祂為中心安排生活，而不是把祂塞進剩餘的空檔

若我們總是把其他事情放在祂之前，或只在方便時才把祂放在首位，那麼我們便不能真正說祂是我們生命的第一位。

本主日也是**聖召祈禱日**。

「**莊稼固然多，而工人卻少；所以你們應當求莊稼的主人，派遣工人來收割祂的莊稼。**」（瑪竇福音 9:37 - 38）

問題從來不是「需不需要聖召」——我們當然需要！

真正的問題是：我們有為聖召祈禱嗎？

- 我們是否每週刻意為司鐸祈禱？
- 我們是否為聖召奉獻犧牲？
- 我們的家庭是否營造出讓年輕人能聽見天主聲音的環境？

天主依然在呼喚。問題不在於祂沉默，而在於我們是否在聆聽。

這幾週，我們堂區充滿恩寵：

- 二年級的孩子們領受了**初領聖體**
- 七年級的學生即將領受**堅振聖事**

這些不只是活動，而是與基督真正相遇的時刻。讓我們祈禱：

- **為父母**——能以信德作榜樣
- **為青年**——能扎根於彌撒與堂區生活
- **為我們的堂區**——繼續成長為一個門徒團體

本週，讓我們誠實地問自己：

- 是誰在塑造我的決定
- 什麼才是我生命真正的優先
- 我是否認得善牧的聲音

然後作出回應，因為最終我們會發現一個簡單而真實的事實：

- ☞ 我們每個人都在跟隨某個人。
- ☞ 我們每個人都在聽某個聲音。

願我們所聽從的，是基督的聲音。

願天主降福你們，也讓我們繼續為聖召祈禱。
