Pastor's Corner

3rd Sunday of Easter



This Sunday's Gospel presents the beautiful encounter on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13–35). Two disciples walk with Jesus, though they do not yet recognize Him:

"But their eyes were kept from recognizing him." (Luke 24:16)

Along the way, Jesus walks with them and opens the Scriptures, revealing how everything points to His Passion and Resurrection:

"Beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself." (Luke 24:27)

As they near their destination, they make a simple, but profound request: **"Stay with us."** (Luke 24:29)

And He does, but in a new way.

At table, He reveals Himself in a deeply Eucharistic moment:

"He took the bread and blessed, and broke it, and gave it to them.

And their eyes were opened and they recognized him." (Luke 24:30–31)

This fourfold action, *He took, blessed, broke, and gave*, echoes the Last Supper: **"This is my body which is given for you."** (Luke 22:19)

What the disciples experienced at Emmaus is what we experience at every Mass. Jesus fulfills His promise to remain with us, not just symbolically, but truly present, as He declares:

"I am the living bread which came down from heaven... and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh." (John 6:51)

An Invitation for All of Us

The Emmaus story is not just about two disciples, it is about each of us.

We are invited:

- to walk with the Lord
- to listen as He opens the Scriptures
- and to recognize Him in the Eucharist

Like the disciples, we are called to allow our hearts to be set on fire:

"Did not our hearts burn within us... while he opened to us the scriptures?" (Luke 24:32)

Sacramental Life in Our Parish

This past week, we were blessed to celebrate the baptism of **16 children**, a powerful sign of new life in Christ.

We now look ahead to:

- **First Holy Communion** – April 25
- **Confirmation (Grade 7)** – April 30, celebrated by Archbishop Smith

Please keep our students and their families in your prayers. Parents, in a particular way, are called to be the first witnesses of faith, helping their children not only to learn the faith, but to live it.

I also want to thank all who helped lead the recent Confirmation retreat. Your generosity and witness are forming the next generation.

A Call to Mission

As our young people prepare to receive the Sacraments, they are also being asked an important question:

How will you give what you have received?

That question is not only for them, it is for all of us.

Our faith is never meant to be kept to ourselves. It is given so that it may be shared, for the building up of God's Kingdom.

Living Our Vision

We are seeing real fruits of our parish vision—through our ministries, our young people, and our growing community. But one area we must continue to strengthen is **Evangelical Hospitality**.

This is something simple, but powerful:

- Greeting someone you do not know
- Smiling and welcoming others

Making people feel seen and at home

Many people, especially young people, are returning to Church, or giving it another chance. **We all have a role to play** in how they are received.

Do not underestimate the impact of a simple welcome

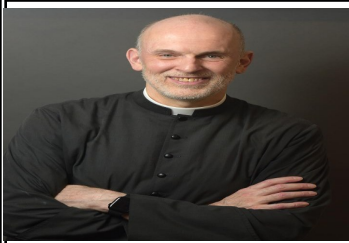
Let us continue this Easter season with gratitude, walking with the Lord, listening to His Word, and recognizing Him in the Eucharist.

復活期第三主
本堂神父的話：

本主日的福音呈現了厄瑪烏路上的美麗相遇（路加福音 24:13 - 35）。兩位門徒與耶穌同行，卻尚未認出祂：

「**他們的眼睛被阻住，不認得祂。**」（路 24:16）

在路途中，耶穌陪伴他們，為他們解釋聖經，指出一切如何指向祂的苦難與復活：

「**祂從梅瑟及眾先知開始，給他們講解經上指著祂的一切話。**」（路 24:27）

臨近目的地時，他們向耶穌提出一個簡單卻深刻的請求：

「**請同我們住下吧。**」（路 24:29）

耶穌答應了，但以一種新的方式臨在。

在餐桌上，祂以深具聖體意義的行動顯示祂自己：

「**祂拿起餅來，祝福了，擘開，遞給他們。他們的眼睛遂開了，便認出了祂。**」（路 24:30 - 31）

這四個動作——**拿起、祝福、擘開、分給**——正呼應最後晚餐：

「**這是我的身體，為你們而交付的。**」（路 22:19）

門徒在厄瑪烏所經驗的，正是我們在每一台彌撒中所經驗的。耶穌實現祂的許諾，不僅象徵性地，而是實實在在地臨在，正如祂所說：

「**我是從天上降下來的生活的食糧……我要賜給世界生命的食糧，就是我的肉。**」（若 6:51）

給我們每一個人的邀請

厄瑪烏的故事不僅關乎兩位門徒，也關乎我們每一個人。

我們被邀請：

- 與主同行
- 聆聽祂為我們開啟聖經

在聖體聖事中認出祂

如同門徒，我們也被召叫讓自己的心被點燃：

「**當祂在路上給我們講解聖經時，我們的心不是火熱的嗎？**」（路 24:32）

本堂的聖事生活

在過去的一週，我們很高興為 16 位兒童施行洗禮——這是基督新生命的美好記號。

接下來，我們將迎來：

- 初領聖體：4 月 25 日

堅振聖事（七年級）：4 月 30 日，由 Smith 總主教主持

請為我們的學生及其家庭祈禱。特別是家長們，被召叫成為孩子們的第一位信仰見證者，不僅教導他們信仰，更陪伴他們活出信仰。

我也特別感謝所有協助最近堅振避靜的弟兄姊妹。你們的慷慨與見證正在塑造下一代。

使命的召叫

當我們的年輕人準備領受聖事時，他們也被問到一個重要的問題：

你將如何把所領受的恩典分享出去？

這個問題不僅是給他們的，也是給我們所有人的。

我們的信仰從來不是只為自己保留，而是為了分享，為了建設天主的國。

活出我們的願景

我們在堂區的願景中看見了許多具體的果實——透過各項事工、青年團體，以及日漸成長的團體生活。然而，有一個領域我們仍需持續加強：**福傳式的款待（Evangelical Hospitality）**。

這其實很簡單，卻非常有力量：

- 主動向不認識的人打招呼
- 以微笑迎接他人

讓人感到被看見、被接納、像在家一樣

許多人，尤其是年輕人，正在回到教會，或願意再給教會一次機會。我們每一個人都在他們的經驗中扮演角色。

不要低估一個簡單歡迎的力量。

結語

讓我們在這復活期繼續懷著感恩之心，與主同行、聆聽祂的聖言、在聖體中認出祂。

也讓我們成為一個不僅領受基督，更把基督帶給他人的堂區。
