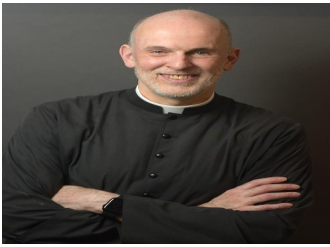

pastor's Corner

Easter Sunday Announcement Day!



Victory has been won-today it is announced.

Easter changes everything! The victory was won on Good Friday, when Jesus, in the midst of darkness, suffering, and apparent defeat, gave His life on the Cross. In that very moment, sin was conquered, the price for our salvation was paid, and the devil was defeated. Heaven knew it! Hell knew it! However, did we know it? Do we, even now? Today, in the Resurrection, that victory is proclaimed, and this proclamation has changed the course of human history. The question now is simple and personal: does it change your history? Does it change my life - today?

“This is the day which the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.” (Psalm 118:24)

Yesterday is over, it ended at midnight. Tomorrow is not guaranteed. Today is the day we are given, the day to allow the victory of Christ to take root in our lives and what does that look like? It begins with priority. If Jesus is not first in our lives, in your life then, His victory is not yet fully alive in us. As Catholics, we live this concretely: by placing the Lord’s Day, specifically Sunday Mass at the center of our week, by returning regularly to Confession, and by committing to daily prayer. We cannot fit Jesus in when everything else is finished. He must come first!

This is an act of trust:

“But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well.” (Matthew 6:33)

We cannot do everything, and neither can your children, but when our priorities are rightly ordered, everything else begins to fall into place. What we desire most is not merely success, but significance, a life transformed by Christ, a life that reflects His victory. So today, ask yourself honestly: do I want this victory to shape my life, my child, or children’s lives and not just something I believe, but something I live?

Remember, the Easter Octave means that every day this week is Easter Day. Every day is a proclamation:

“He is not here; for he has risen, as he said.” (Matthew 28:6)

I want to express and give heartfelt thanks to God for the extraordinary fruits witnessed at the Easter Vigil, where 20 adults were baptized and 2 were received into full communion with the Church. This is a powerful sign that the Lord is at work among us. We do not take this for granted, nor can we become complacent. Instead, we give thanks and ask, “Lord, what next?”

At this time I, along with Fr Patrick, want to express my deep gratitude to my staff overseen by Winnie Shiao and the many people and ministries who made Holy Week and Easter such a beautiful and prayerful celebration. Thank you to our choirs and music leaders, Schola, Kevin, Dominica, Vincent, and all who gave so generously of their time and talent to lead us in worship. Thank you to those who prepared the sanctuary and flowers, creating a space that lifts our hearts to God. Thank you to our ushers, who embody evangelical hospitality; our lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, who serve with reverence and care; and those who quietly clean and maintain our church, often unnoticed, but absolutely essential.

To all our volunteers, ministry leaders, and parishioners who stepped forward in both seen and unseen ways: thank you! Your generosity and leadership make this parish a true place of encounter with Jesus Christ.

Easter Saturday morning, of the Octave, we will celebrate the baptism of the children of those received into the Church. Please keep these families in your prayers, that this new life in Christ will grow strong, and that these children will be guided and formed as true disciples of Jesus in his Catholic Church.

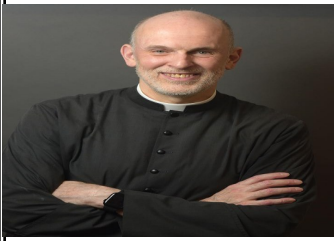
Let us continue to pray for one another, that the victory of Christ may not only be proclaimed, but fully lived in each of us.

Pastor's Corner

本堂神父的話 宣佈的日子！



勝利已經完成——今天正式宣佈。

復活節改變一切！勝利是在聖週五完成的：當耶穌在黑暗、痛苦與看似失敗之中，將自己的生命獻在十字架上。就在那一刻，罪惡被征服，我們得救的代價已被付清，魔鬼被擊敗。天堂知道了！地獄知道了！然而，我們知道嗎？我們現在真的知道嗎？今天，在主的復活中，這份勝利被宣告，而這宣告改變了整個人類歷史。現在的問題既簡單又個人：它是否改變你的歷史？它今天是否改變我的生命？

「這是上主所安排的一天，我們應該為此鼓舞喜歡。」
(詠 118:24)

昨天已經過去，在午夜結束；明天並不保證會到來。今天我們所領受的日子，是讓基督的勝利在我們生命中扎根的日子——那會是什麼模樣？一切從優先次序開始。如果耶穌不是我們生命中的第一位，不是你生命中的第一位，那麼祂的勝利尚未在我們內完全活起來。作為天主教徒，我們以具體的方式生活這份優先：把主日，特別是主日彌撒，放在每週的中心，常常回到修和聖事，並堅持每日祈禱。我們不能把耶穌放在所有事情做完之後的位置；祂必須是第一！

這是一份信賴的行動：

「你們先該尋求天主的國和祂的義德，這一切自會加給你們。」(瑪 6:33)

我們不能做所有的事，你的孩子們也不能；但當我們的優先次序正確時，其他一切便開始就位。我們最渴望的並不只是成功，而是意義，一個被基督轉化的生命，一個反映祂勝利的生命。所以今天，請誠實地問自己：我是否願意讓這份勝利塑造我的生命、我孩子或孩子們的生命？不只是我所相信的，而是我真正活出來的？

請記得，復活節八日慶意味著這整個星期的每一天都是復活節。每天都是一份宣告：

「祂不在這裡，因為祂已照祂所說的復活了。」(瑪 28:6)

我也要向天主獻上由衷的感恩，為我們在復活前夕所見證的非凡果實：有二十位成人領受了洗禮，兩位加入了與教會的圓滿共融。這是主在我們中間工作的強而有力的記號。我們不能把這視為理所當然，也不能因此自滿；相反，我們感謝天主，並問：「主啊，下一步是什麼？」

在此，我與 Patrick 神父一起，向由 Winnie Shiao 帶領的教職員團隊，以及所有在聖週與復活節中付出心力，使禮儀如此美麗而充滿祈禱氣氛的眾多人士與善會，致上深深的謝意。感謝我們的詠唱團與音樂領導者——Schola、Kevin、Dominica、Vincent——以及所有慷慨奉獻時間與才華，引領我們進入禮儀的人。感謝那些布置聖堂與鮮花的人，使我們的心被提升向天主。感謝我們的接待員，他們展現福傳式的款待；感謝讀經員與非常務送聖體員，他們以敬禮與細心服務；也感謝那些默默清潔與維護教堂的人，他們常常不被看見，卻絕對不可或缺。

向所有義工、善會領袖與在明顯或隱密方式中挺身而出的教友們：謝謝你們！你們的慷慨與領導，使本堂真正成為與耶穌基督相遇的地方。

在復活節八日慶的星期六早上，我們將為那些在復活前夕加入教會的家庭的孩子們施行洗禮。請為這些家庭祈禱，願這在基督內的新生命茁壯成長，並願這些孩子在天主教會內被培育成真正的耶穌門徒。

讓我們繼續彼此代禱，使基督的勝利不僅被宣告，更能在我們每一個人身上完全活出來。

願天主降福你們，並祝大家復活節愉快。
