Pastor's Corner
3rd Sunday of Lent



This Sunday, in Gospel of John 4, Jesus says to the woman at the well:

“Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst.”

Water gives life.
Water refreshes.
Water renews.

It is that renewal I want to highlight.

Last weekend, three significant signs of renewal unfolded at Corpus Christi, not trophies to display, but manifestations of the Holy Spirit at work in our parish and in our 10-Year Vision.

Our **Young Adults**, led by Father Patrick, went on retreat to Westminster Abbey. What occurred there was deeply fruitful - team building, prayer, discernment, and renewal for a ministry that is just beginning to take shape.

Many of these young adults grew up in our **Youth Ministry**. Now they are stepping into leadership as young adults. Do we realize how important that is? This is the Holy Spirit sustaining discipleship across generations. This is renewal!

We also had a deeply encouraging **Senior Leadership Team** meeting. For the first time, Catherine joined us for a full working session.

She offered a great presentation on Welcoming Ministry, directly aligned with our core value of Evangelical Hospitality. This is not peripheral. It is central to who we are becoming.

Our **Alpha** community gathered for a **Day Away** at All Saints Parish. The reports were consistent: a powerful, grace-filled day. The Holy Spirit continues to touch hearts in extraordinary ways.

From Alpha flows RCIA.
From RCIA we are aiming for Life Groups.
From Life Groups flows sustained discipleship.

And There Is More

Senior Youth gathered after Stations of the Cross.

Our **Friday morning Men’s Ministry**, began with prayer in the church, formation in the parish library, fraternity and faith shared over coffee.

These are not isolated activities. They flow from the Eucharist, the source and summit of the Christian life. We come to Mass not only to receive Christ, but to be sent by Him. From the altar flows mission.

I simply ask you to reflect on this question:

Not “Should I be involved?”
But “How can I respond?”

Perhaps by praying more intentionally.
Perhaps by joining the next Alpha
Perhaps by joining a ministry.
Perhaps by encouraging someone else.

Renewal is not abstract. It is concrete. It is happening and it belongs to all of us.

Jesus offers living water, not merely to refresh us privately, but to renew us as a parish family.

This is only the beginning.



Pastor's Corner

本堂神父的話

"大齋期第三日".



本主日，在若望福音第四章中，耶穌對井旁的婦人說：

「凡喝這水的，還要再渴；但誰若喝我所賜的水，他永遠不會渴。」

水賦予生命。

水使人清新。

水使人更新。

今天我想強調的，就是這份「更新」。

上個週末，在基督聖體堂內出現了三個重要的更新記號——不是用來展示的獎盃，而是聖神在我們堂區及我們十年願景中運作的具體彰顯。

我們的**青年成人組**在 Patrick 神父帶領下，到西敏寺修院進行退省。那裡所發生的一切都非常豐富——團隊建立、祈禱、辨別，以及對一個剛開始成形的事工而言極具意義的更新。

這些青年成人當中，許多人是從我們的**青少年事工**成長起來的，如今他們開始以青年成人的身份承擔領導角色。我們是否意識到這有多重要？這是聖神在跨世代持續培育門徒。這就是更新！

我們也舉行了一次非常鼓舞人心的**高層領導團隊會議**。這是 Catherine 第一次全程參與工作會議。

她就**迎新接待事工**作了精彩的簡報，與我們的核心價值——「福傳性的款待」——完全一致。這不是附屬的事，而是我們正在成為的教會核心之一。

此外，我們的**Alpha 團體**在諸聖堂舉行了「外出一天」。回報非常一致：那是一個充滿恩寵、力量深厚的一天。聖神繼續以非凡的方式觸動人心。

Alpha 帶來**慕道 (RCIA)**。

慕道帶來**生命小組 (Life Groups)**的目標。

生命小組帶來**持續的門徒生活**。

而且，還有更多。

高年級青少年在拜苦路後聚集。

週五早晨的男子事工，從教堂祈禱開始，在圖書館接受培育，並在咖啡中分享弟兄情誼與信仰。

這些並不是彼此孤立的活動。它們都源自聖體聖事，基督徒生活的泉源與高峰。我們來參與彌撒，不只是為了領受基督，更是為了被祂派遣。使命從祭台流出。

我只想邀請你思考這個問題：

不是「我應該參與嗎？」

而是「我可以如何回應？」

也許是更有意識地祈禱。

也許是參加下一期 Alpha。

也許是加入一個事工。

也許是鼓勵另一個人。

更新不是抽象的。它是具體的。它正在發生，而且它屬於我們每一個人。耶穌所賜的活水，不只是為了私下滋潤我們，而是為了更新我們整個堂區家庭。

這只是開始。
