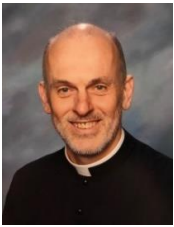
"Now the Lord has spoken who formed me as his servant from the womb..." Isaiah 49:5

In Ordinary Time, the buzzword is 'discipleship'. I include a link here to Fr. Jeffrey Kirby's article that is online. It is a good article to help you see the importance and value of the season that we call Ordinary Time

Here is just the beginning of Fr. Kirby's article. If you find this interesting you can read the rest (it will not take long, but it will benefit you for a long time):

"The liturgical season is an opportunity to hear the Gospel again and recommit ourselves to the Lord Jesus and his most excellent way of love.

With this emphasis in mind, we could say that the buzzword for Ordinary Time is discipleship. And, truly, such a work is greatly needed today. The struggle of the Church is a struggle with discipleship.

As believers, do we understand what it means to be a disciple of the Lord? Are we seeking every day to fulfill the upward calling we have received in Jesus Christ?

During Ordinary Time, we are invited to perceive anew why it's important to have a relationship with the Lord. The grace of faith is poured into us at baptism. If we're not careful, this grace can sit in our souls and never fully be used."

This year Corpus Christi will have 40 Hours Adoration. Mark it in your schedules/calendars: Monday, February 13th – Friday, February 17th. The schedule for Adoration will be posted shortly and both I and Fr. Richard will be strongly encouraging people to make some time to be with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

Here is a brief true story about this importance of Adoration. When I visited my mother last week in Calgary, I met a person who is a kind of caregiver for her. In our conversation it came out that she is Catholic, and she said she returned to the practice of her faith when she...started to spend time with Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament (Adoration).

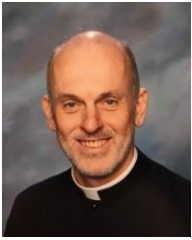
Jesus will help you come back to practice your faith; Jesus will strengthen your faith; Jesus may even “drag” your family members, always respecting their freedom, back to the Faith IF you and I sacrifice ourselves to be with him.

Why would anyone else want to be with Him if we can’t tell them from personal experience that “to be with Jesus in Adoration is the greatest thing!” So we need to commit ourselves, our time, to be with him during this time of blessing: 40 Hours Adoration.

I want to wish all our Asian parishioners a very Happy and Joy-filled Lunar New Year. I pray that this year will be one filled with God’s blessing for you and your families.

考慮到這一點，我們可以說常年期的流行述語是門徒精神。而且，確實，今天非常需要這樣的工作。教會的奮鬥是與門徒的一份奮鬥。

作為信徒，我們明白成為主的門徒意味著什麼嗎？我們是否每天都在尋求滿全我們從耶穌基督處領受到向上的呼叫？

在常年期，我們被邀請重新認知為什麼與主建立關係是重要的。信德的聖寵在領洗時向我們傾注。如果我們不小心，這聖寵只會在我們靈魂內，未被完全地使用。』

今年基督聖體聖血堂會有 40 小時的朝拜聖體。把它記在你日曆/日程中：二月十三日至二月十七日。朝拜聖體的時程表將很快公佈，我和 **Richard** 神父都將強烈鼓勵大家花一些時間在聖體中與耶穌在一起。

這裡有一個關於朝拜的重要性的簡短真實故事。當我上周在卡加利拜訪我的母親時，我遇到了一個照顧她的人。在我們的談話中，發現她是天主教徒，她說當她.....開始在朝拜聖禮時，她回歸去實踐她的信仰。

耶穌會幫助你回來實踐你的信仰；耶穌會加強你的信德；如果你和我犧牲自己與祂一起，尊重著他們的自由，耶穌甚至可以“拖”你的家人回到信仰中。

如果我們不能從個人經驗中告訴他們『在朝拜聖體與耶穌在一起是最美好的事情！』，為什麼其他人願意與祂在一起！因此，我們需要投入我們自己，我們的時間，在這個祝福的時刻與祂一起：40 小時朝拜。

Dear Fr. Hamilton, Fr. Richard and Corpus Christi Parishioners:

My name is Anna Loch and I am the new executive assistant to Fr. Bruce-John Hamilton here at Corpus Christi Parish. As the executive assistant, I will assist Fr. Hamilton in his carrying out of the 10-year vision here at the parish.



I look forward to meeting you in person. In the meantime, Fr. Hamilton has asked me to introduce myself. I will start by sharing a little story about how the Lord brought me to this parish.

About 4 months ago I was in a rut at work, confused about what God wanted for me and feeling quite disconnected from community and people in the aftermath of the pandemic. Even though Corpus wasn't my Parish I had come to confession a couple of times to Fr. Hamilton and found him very insightful and helpful. So, I asked if I could meet with him to talk about what else I could do to better listen to God's voice and discern his will.

I shared with Fr. Hamilton what I was already doing, and then he gave me some suggestions. The suggestion that stood out the most - and was probably the most challenging as well - was a daily hour of adoration.

Then and there amidst the surprise, I was also filled with a sense of peace and confirmation. I told the Lord: If you are calling me to this, I trust you'll give me the daily time, energy and the desire for it. Starting that very day, I began doing a daily hour of adoration or mental prayer. Sometimes a whole hour at once. Sometimes two 30-minute prayer times. Very quickly I noticed differences in my life, in my work, in my emotions. People around me started noticing it as well and would comment saying that I looked better, I seemed more grounded and at peace. I started sharing with family, friends and coworkers about how wonderful it was to be with Our Lord and some of them started joining me once a week. A lady at work started doing 30 minutes of adoration or mental prayer a day and then shared with her friends, and now they are praying as well. It has truly been a gift.

As Fr. Hamilton said to me: How can you show in the way you schedule your time that Christ is at the center of your life? I love how he is both gentle and direct. For me adoration has become a concrete and delightful way of putting God first.

Anyhow, little by little many good things came my way: new friendships, healing, I decided to go part time at work and look for another job. During this time even though I was doing adoration every day, I seemed to have even more time for what really mattered and what was life-giving. I had more clarity about who I was, what was important and what was not.

One day I noticed the job posting for executive assistant to Fr. Hamilton and the rest is history.

The length of this "Introduction" flows from my passion about adoration. It's like I discovered this hidden treasure or antidote to a serious illness, and I really want for it to be yours as well.

Just come to adoration as you are: open your heart, be honest with Him. As Fr. Richard says, Give God your worst. Give Him the joy of being your Saviour. You are worth saving, you are worth encountering. You are worth loving. And then come and share with one of us your experience.

I'd love that Corpus Christi become known for it's people in love with the Blessed Sacrament: Eucharistic hearts ablaze with His love.

Two things about me and why I'm excited to work at Corpus:

1. I love responding to real felt needs

During Mass not long ago I was trying to find an image to describe how I see myself in this new role; and what came to mind was the passage of the wedding feast of Cana. Our Lady noticed that there was no wine and brought the need to Jesus. I'm not saying that I'm Mary and that Fr. Hamilton is Jesus; but in the same way that Mother Mary with her feminine eye picked up on the real need of the wedding party and brought it to Jesus who then performed a work of mercy and spiritual significance; I would love to notice and bring to Fr. Hamilton and Fr. Richard the personal and communal needs of all of you.

I love hearing people's stories, what moves you, where you're at, what you need, what you're looking for ... because I believe that God works through our needs, desires, through what He puts on our hearts.

2. I love the Corpus Christi team

First, I love working on teams. I love the art and experience of making a difference together. Being part of something bigger than yourself where everyone's gifts are celebrated and encouraged. One of the things that the priests said to me when I was hired is that they'd like to see me flourish in using my gifts and what brings me joy. What boss has ever said that to you on being hired?

And I can see they truly believe this and want it for everyone at this parish: that you flourish as a son or daughter of our heavenly Father: becoming the fullness of who you are called to be.

Yes, we want volunteers, we need volunteers for all sorts of things; but the priests and leadership team here has reminded me that God wants to love us much more than He wants to make use of our gifts. He wants our involvement to be a gift to us, an opportunity for growth, community and celebration.
