Pastor's Corner

4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Part 111

Vision Part 111



As we arrive at the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we also find ourselves at the threshold of a new month. January has come and gone, and February opens before us filled with many blessings, throughout the Church, and very concretely here at Corpus Christi Parish.

In many ways, this reflection serves as a *"Part Three"* of my last two Pastor's Corners, where I spoke about **vision** and about how essential it is not only to *have* a vision, but to *respond* to it.

Two weeks ago, we heard a powerful testimony from Gabriel Kosh about the emerging Young Adults Ministry at Corpus Christi. This is something we must not take for granted. It would be easy to listen politely and move on, but that would miss what God is actually doing in our midst.

Father Patrick made a simple, but profound observation to me (in reference to the Young Adult Ministry springing up): *the vision works*. The fruit we are beginning to see in our Youth and Young Adults Ministries is not accidental. Our Young Adults Ministry has flowed organically out of our Youth Ministry, and both are clear signs that our 10-Year Vision is alive and bearing fruit.

However, the vision must be **worked**. The vision must be **responded to**. Otherwise, it risks being stalled, or not bearing the fruit God intends, especially in our own lives. It is incumbent upon all of us to pay attention to how God is moving, particularly in the lives of our young people.

Gabriel shared how the Holy Spirit touched his heart, how his encounter with Christ, especially during his time in Rome, led him upon returning home to gather other young adults and ask for this ministry to begin. **I did not initiate this.** I did not plan it and in many ways, that is precisely what makes it so beautiful. This is the vision growing organically, responding to real needs, and being carried forward by those it is meant to serve.

For this reason, I want to encourage every parishioner to **pray intentionally** for the supernatural fruitfulness of our Youth and Young Adults Ministries. When you hear discouraging narratives about young people, whether in the news, or in everyday conversation, pause and look instead at what is happening right here in our parish. Young men and women are being given the opportunity to grow as human persons and, most importantly, to deepen their relationship with God. This is deeply hopeful. It is also something that must be supported, by prayer, by encouragement, and at times by our financial sacrifices offered faithfully in the collection.

Please do not take this for granted. This is a blessing of the Lord. We must thank Him for it and pray for its continued growth.

February also brings with it many other graces. On February 3rd, I will be blessing the throats of our students for the Feast of St. Blaise. I will also be blessing our PREP children on February 11th. This coming Friday is First Friday. We will have Mass at 8:00 a.m., Exposition and a Holy Hour at 6:00 p.m., followed by First Friday Mass at 7:00 p.m. I encourage you, if you are able, to make this extra Mass

part of your spiritual life this month.

There are still more blessings unfolding. I have begun having conversations with the Archdiocese regarding the completion of our Campus Master Plan, most notably the seismic upgrading of our church, the construction of a new mission-aligned parish office, the expansion of our Adoration Chapel and, God willing, the completion of the Plan with a new school field.

We still have a long way to go, but it is essential that we stop, acknowledge, and thank God for the blessings we are already receiving, individually and as a parish family.

Thank you for your faith, your prayer, and your generosity. Let us continue to keep one another in prayer.

Pastor's Corner

常年期第四主日

本堂神父的話

願景（第三部分）



當我們來到常年期第四主日，也同時踏入新的月份。一月來了又已過去，二月在我們眼前展開，帶來許多祝福，不僅在整個教會內，也非常具體地臨現於我們聖體堂的堂區生活中。

在許多方面，這篇分享可視為我前兩篇「本堂神父的話」的「第三部分」，我在前兩篇中談到願景，以及不僅需要擁有願景，更需要對願景作出回應的重要性。

兩週前，我們聽到 Gabriel Kosh 分享他在本堂逐漸成形的青年成人事工的見證。這不是我們可以視為理所當然的事。若只是禮貌地聽過便算了，我們便會錯過天主正在我們中間所做的事。

Patrick 神父曾向我提出一個簡單卻深刻的觀察（關於青年成人事工的興起），他說：願景正在運作。我們在青少年事工與青年成人事工中開始看到的果實並非偶然。青年成人事工是從青少年事工自然延伸而來，而這兩者都是我們十年願景正在活出並結出果實的明顯記號。

然而，願景需要被實踐，需要我們作出回應。否則，它可能停滯，或無法在我們生命中結出天主所期望的果實。因此，我們每一位都需要留心天主的帶領，特別是在我們的年輕人身上。

Gabriel 分享了聖神如何觸動他的心，分享了他在羅馬與基督相遇的經驗如何在他回到家後，促使他召集其他青年成人並提出成立事工的請求。這不是我主動發起的，也不是我計畫的，而正因如此，它更顯得美麗。這是願景自然地成長，回應真實的需要，並由那些最需要它的人親自承擔與推動。

因此，我想鼓勵每位教友，為我們的青少年事工與青年成人事工的超性果實，作出刻意而持續的祈禱。當你在新聞或日常對話中聽到對年輕人的負面敘述時，請停下來，看看我們堂區正在發生的事。年輕的弟兄姊妹正被賦予機會，在人格上成長，更重要的是，在與天主的關係中深化。這是極大的希望，也是需要我們以祈禱、鼓勵，以及在需要時以經濟奉獻支持的事工。

請不要視之為理所當然。這是天主的祝福。我們必須為此感謝祂，並祈求祂使這份恩典繼續成長。

二月也帶來許多其他恩寵。二月三日，我將為我們的學生祝福聖布雷茲的咽喉祝福；二月十一日，我也會為 PREP 的孩子們祝福。本週五是首瞻禮六，我們將於早上八時舉行彌撒，下午六時明供聖體與一小時朝拜，並於晚上七時舉行首瞻禮六彌撒。如果你能參與，我鼓勵你在本月將這台額外的彌撒納入你的靈修生活。

還有更多祝福正在展開。我已開始與總教區討論完成我們校園總體規劃的後續步驟，其中包括：教堂的耐震加固工程、一座符合使命導向的新堂區辦公室、朝拜小堂的擴建，以及若天主願意，完成整體規劃中的新校園運動場。

我們仍有很長的路要走，但在這旅程中，我們必須停下來，承認並感謝天主已經在我們個人與整個堂區家庭中所賜下的恩典。

感謝你們的信德、祈禱與慷慨。讓我們繼續彼此代禱。願天主降福你們！
